Along with The Cone Exchange shop, we support social enterprises and charities by repurposing our waste and equipment and providing meaningful work experience for young people with additional learning needs. We also attend events and talks to encourage recycling and raise funds at the same time.

What do we do with the waste materials we receive?

DONATE

We welcome donations from local businesses and members of the community who donate clean, scrap and unwanted craft materials that can be repurposed for sale at a low cost whilst raising funds for local good causes.

SELL

A selection of donated materials is kept for sale in the Cone Exchange shop to sell for hobbies and crafting, raising funds for local social enterprises as well as supporting tree planting and tree preservation in Yorkshire.

RE-USE

Some of our scrap is used to make products to promote educational awareness at shows and fairs working with children and young people.

Preparations for these events come from our volunteers and young adults with learning difficulties who come to us for work placements.

By encouraging the reuse and repurposing of items that some might consider 'trash' into treasure, we try to capture people's imaginations and show them how they can make a difference to protect the planet and raise funds for local good causes.

We don't do it alone. Our thanks go to all those businesses, volunteers, work placement students, charities, customers and colleagues, who show their support and commitment to helping the Cone Exchange.



Henshaws offers a creative and supportive environment for adults with additional needs. The Cone Exchange has worked in partnership with Henshaws to offer supported work experience for their students for many years.

Typically, our placement students spend one day a week at the Cone Exchange, helping with a variety of tasks which build confidence, communication and self-esteem. In some cases, placements are a step towards paid work.

stitch society.

The Stitch Society creates simple, durable workwear made responsibly in their studio in Yorkshire. The Cone Exchange has worked with the Stitch Society for a few years, collecting waste fabrics, zips, binding and other sewing and haberdashery related materials.

COW VINTAGE

Cow Vintage is an independent vintage clothing and accessories retailer offering a sustainable alternative to fast fashion, with several stores across the UK.

"We first started working with the Cone Exchange about two years ago. The Cone Exchange would take our scrap fabrics left over after we reworked damaged clothing into new garments. Although our re-work studio has now closed, we still process all clothes in our Leeds warehouse, before they're distributed to our shops across the UK. Although we try to mend or wash any damaged clothes, sometimes pieces are too far gone and that's when the Cone Exchange comes in. Cow Vintage is built on the mentality of re-use, re-work, re-purpose, so our partnership is a match made in heaven."

PEACE OF MIND & OUR KNITTING PROJECT

CASE STUDY

Peace of Mind is a refugee-led charity which supports newly arrived and existing refugees and asylum seekers to integrate into new and unfamiliar surroundings and to overcome some of the difficulties they face. The charity's services include advocacy, and emergency relief, for not only the refugees and asylum seeker (RAS) community but also for local residents though a national warm spaces scheme and emergency food relief.

Suzy Garraghan, Taylors Tea Buying team:

"The pandemic was such a precarious time for people seeking asylum as they were often not yet registered as part of any system to receive support. During this time, Peace of Mind expanded their support from providing advocacy to the refugee and asylum-seeking community to direct basic food support, and that's how we first came across the charity, when we organised some tea to go into their food packages.

We became aware of the precarious and temporary accommodation people had, often with no belongings and that's when we realised we could link up the incredible knitting from the Cone Exchange volunteers and the people accessing Peace of Mind's Services. Since then, blankets, hats, scarves, quilt, toys, baby sets, booties, and more have all been made for recipients facing some of the most difficult circumstances.

Every quarter, I collect bags full of items from the Cone Exchange, with donations increasing every time. When I get home, I unpack everything on my kitchen table to sort and take stock of the amazing skill and talent of the Cone Exchange volunteers in what they've made but also the deep thoughtfulness and kindness. For people receiving them, who have very often lost so much, to feel that someone has thought about them and made something specifically for them offers so much comfort. It is the most enormous privilege to transport the knitting from Harrogate to Peace of Mind."








Saint Michael's is a local hospice care charity supporting people affected by terminal illness across the Harrogate district. Their belief is that no-one should have to face terminal illness alone – and they support local people and their families when they need them most. Last year alone, across the charity's family of services it supported 3,000 people in North Yorkshire and via tailored support nationally.

Saint Michael's Hospice have worked with the Cone Exchange for several years. The Cone Exchange team have made tote bags and syringe driver pouches that are truly unique, just like the patients that Saint Michael's Hospice supports.

Most recently, the team of volunteers have created many bags and pouches for patients, not only at Saint Michael's, but also for the charity's new hospice facility that is about to open in Thirsk – Herriot Hospice@The Lambert, provided by Herriot Hospice Homecare, part of Saint Michael's family of services and wider charity.



It is incredible how everything the Cone Exchange team creates comes from items that have been donated to them. CASE STUDY

WORKING WITH HORTICAP



Horticap is a Harrogate-based charity that provides horticultural experience for adults with additional needs in a supportive and caring environment. Bettys & Taylors Group first started working with Horticap back in 2005 when they were chosen as the charity of the year by Bettys Bakery.

The funds raised covered the costs for a second polytunnel to be built at the garden centre, providing much needed extra covered growing area for the nursery's seedlings and plants. From there, the relationship grew and the Cone Exchange has developed a particularly close partnership with Horticap across various projects and through in-kind donations, such as crockery for Hopkins café and a gazebo, to mushroom baskets which are used for plant sales, coffee sacks for the nursery, office furniture that was no longer needed, and wooden pallets which some of the students have used to make garden furniture and composters.

Donations of wool and craft supplies also come in handy for Horticap students to work with when poor weather prevents them from doing their usual horticultural jobs outdoors.

In turn, the team at Horticap collects and donates lots of fabric from businesses which the Cone Exchange can then re-purpose for sales in our shop. Not only this, but the team are always on hand to help support with one-off projects as well, making this a particularly unique collaboration.

WORKING TOGETHER WITH THE YORKSHIRE DALES MILLENIUM TRUST

The Yorkshire Dales Millenium Trust (YDMT) is a charity doing big things to support people, landscape and wildlife in the Yorkshire Dales and surrounding areas. Their diverse and inspirational projects help to create habitats for wildlife, tackle climate change and empower people to stand up for nature.

The Cone Exchange and YDMT have been working together since 2019. Our partnership covers a range of activity that supports YDMT's woodland creation work and its wider woodland programme.





TREE PLANTING

Since 2019 Cone Exchange donations have supported the planting of 1,947 trees, which will go on to capture approximately 325 tonnes of carbon dioxide over the next 50 years.

WOODLAND MANAGEMENT

To enhance the biodiversity and health of small woodlands.

ACCESS TO NATURE

Outreach work enables people from marginalised groups to access and help care for our woodlands in this special part of the world

WOODLAND TRAINEES

This programme addresses the shortage of young people coming into the forestry and conservation sector, whilst providing environmental job opportunities and pathways for young people.

COMMUNITY TREE GROWING

The Seed to Sapling project supports communities to grow native tree saplings and rarer montane species from local providence seed that are well adapted to the Dales climate.
